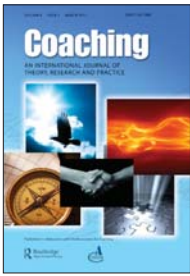

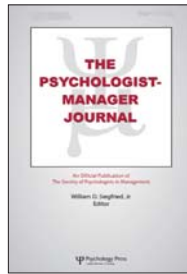

- **Research Tools for the Psychologist-Manager:** Original empirical research relevant to the practicing psychologist-manager. Studies of applications of management to psychology or psychology to management are welcome, provided they have clear and direct implications for the psychologist-manager.
- **Book Reviews and Other Submissions:** Innovative contributions of value to psychologist-managers are encouraged.
