### **Announcement - and Call for Nominations**

The *Journal of Clinical and Experimental Neuropsychology* Announces a change in Editorial Board structure, and a Call for Nominations for two Associate Editors.

For nearly a decade and a half the *Journal of Clinical and Experimental Neuropsychology* has been edited by Professor Wilfred Van Gorp, with Professor Daniel Tranel joining him in 2003. During that period the journal has grown in size and stature, and is now publishing 10 issues per year. In the 2010 Journal citation reports it has an impact factor of 1.805, and the current rejection rate is 60%. Professor Van Gorp, who has played a pivotal role in the ongoing success of JCEN and has intimately shaped its character and quality, has decided to step down as co-Editor from the end of the current volume.

Following on this impending change, there has been a decision to amend the editorial structure of JCEN. On recommendation from Professor Van Gorp and with the support of the Publisher, Professor Tranel has agreed to take the role of sole Editor-in-Chief, commencing in 2012. We now seek two Associate Editors to work with Professor Tranel in reviewing new submissions, building the publication's content and upholding the journal's quality standards. Associates are sought for an initial term of three years. Desirable traits in a candidate for Associate Editor include breadth of knowledge in Clinical and/or Experimental Neuropsychology, maintenance of high standards in research and practice, and a demonstrated ability to exercise timely, clear, and fair judgements in difficult decision-making circumstances as well as good organizational skills and a high degree of commitment.

Nominations (including self-nominations, which are welcomed) should be sent in the first instance to the Publisher, Psychology Press (a member of the Taylor & Francis Group), for the attention of Rohays Perry, Head of Behavioral Sciences (Journals) at [Rohays.perry@tandf.co.uk](mailto:Rohays.perry@tandf.co.uk). Nominees must include a letter of interest, specifically referring to why they feel they are particularly qualified for the role of Associate Editor of JCEN. A CV must also be included.

Nominations will close on 5<sup>th</sup> August 2011 and will be considered by a committee of parties who have been involved with the journal for many years. Associates will be supported by an annual stipend as well as the online manuscript and peer review management system ScholarOne, and Editorial staff based at the Publisher's offices.
